English Public Library Biougra, Morocco



PROJECT NAME: Biougra Public Library, Chtouka Ait Baha province, southern Morocco

PROJECT SUMMARY:

We will develop an English-language public library in the town of Biougra, in the far south of Morocco. This is a very under-resourced region with an Amazigh (Berber) population, and it will be the FIRST public English library EVER, anywhere in rural Morocco. The library will serve students and teachers from primary and secondary schools in the area, as well as the general population. English language literacy classes will also be offered.

PROJECT PARTNERS:

The Global Uplift Project (TGUP) helps American students and individuals build classrooms and other infrastructure projects in the developing world. Since its founding in 2007, TGUP has completed more than 140 such projects in 16 countries in Asia, Central America, and Africa. TGUP is an IRS registered 501c3 nonprofit.

Morocco Library Project (MLP) has been developing English libraries in underserved communities of Morocco since January 2014. MLP works closely with English teachers in these communities to understand the context and need of the local students and then curates a library tailored just for them. The books are purchased in partnership with the independent bookstore Books, Inc. in Palo Alto, through a generous educator's discount. MLP sends high-quality fiction and nonfiction literature in all genres and reading levels.

Most of MLP's libraries are at public high schools in Morocco; a few others are at youth centers, developed in partnership with the Peace Corps. These libraries generally work with after-school English clubs for extremely motivated students and support extracurricular activities including literature circles, writing competitions, and environmental education that draws on the library resources. The libraries are in rural areas that have never had libraries before, either at school or for the public. Many in the young generation in Morocco are passionate about learning English, and MLP, working with dedicated Moroccan teachers, helps to make that possible.

One of MLP themes is to inspire interest in STEM and environmental topics so they include books on science, technology, and nature, and encourage related projects with the partner teacher. For example, they send books such as the picture-rich DK Eyewitness nature series; *The Way Things Work*; Smithsonian visual encyclopedias on science, space and inventions; books on climate such as *Drawdown*; and stories about inspiring people in STEM, such as *Hidden Figures*, *Girls Think of Everything*, *The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind*; and young reader biographies from Steve Jobs to Wangari Maathai. Generally, 15 to 20 percent of the books sent are of this genre, unless the teacher has an interest for more.

MLP is a program of OliveSeed Foundation, a 501c3 based in Palo Alto, California, whose mission is to inspire and empower the next generation of global citizens through literacy programs and environmental education.

ABOUT THE COMMUNITY AND PROJECT:

Biougra is a town of about 38,000 in rural southern Morocco, with an Amaizigh (Berber) population. This is an underserved region with many of the inhabitants working in small-scale farming. The library will be located in a poor, overcrowded neighborhood of Biougra not far from Ibn Sina High School, where Ali Amhal is an English teacher. A



community organization with help from Mr. Amhal is constructing a community center that will house the library.

The native language of the local population is a Moroccan dialect of Arabic, influenced by the Berber culture. This will be the first English public library in rural Morocco. It will serve students and teachers from two high schools, one middle school, two primary schools, and two private schools, as well as the general population.

The library will be managed and maintained by the staff of the community center and English teachers from local secondary schools. Mr. Amhal is heading this team. He has been one of the most active and creative teachers in MLP for over 4 years, and he is also a board member of OliveSeed Foundation. The community center is planning to give English and other courses to cover ongoing expenses of the site, including electricity, internet, and a librarian.

Teachers will use the library for community-oriented activities as an extension of what they already do with after-school clubs, including literature circles, public presentations, environmental projects, and national writing competitions with other schools in the MLP network.

ANTICIPATED BENEFITS:

This project will help bring literacy, love of learning, greater awareness of the world, and greater breadth of knowledge to a new generation in Morocco. Our goal is for young people to be not just readers, but also critical thinkers and leaders who see themselves in the global context which is their emerging reality. Our hope is that this next generation will have the literacy, knowledge, confidence, perspective, and connections to make a positive impact on the world.

Mr. Amhal reports these expected activities and benefits:

- Give high school and university students (who will come from Agadir) free access to books in English
- Promote students' English language proficiency and their love for books
- Build bridges between cultures and identities through reading books of different genres and origins
- Spread knowledge, positive mindset, hope, and guidance towards a better future
- Provide a space for teachers and students alike to come together every weekend to have a cup of tea and discuss a book, a story, a poem, or a movie
- Lend books every day to students to read at home, write book reviews, and record short videos to share with other students on the MLP YouTube channel
- Encourage teachers to resume their habit of reading (A large number of teachers have quit reading because of their busy everyday routines and because they do not have access to high-quality books in English. Bookstores in Morocco, when they can be found, sell only Arabic or French.)
- Help girls gain more confidence and knowledge to voice their minds (As a teacher and MLP coordinator at Ibn Sina High School, I have noticed that girls are more interested in reading books than boys.)

PRIMARY BENEFICIARIES:

The primary beneficiaries are students in and around Biougra and their families, who today have almost no enrichment to amplify their education. In many of MLP's current library locations around Morocco (over 35 in all), students have taken the lead by learning how to manage their own English clubs, writing book reviews and essays, or becoming motivated on environmental issues, even presenting to classes and conducting interviews on conservation. The illiteracy rate among local adult women is close to 100%.

We expect the impact here to be even greater than the libraries situated only in schools, as it will be open to multiple schools, and to the general public, and will bring together students, teachers and aspiring readers from all of those different settings.

An estimated 70% of the expected users belong to an unprivileged social class, such as builders, farmworkers, single mothers, drivers, and store workers. The rest of the expected users are relatively more comfortable and currently more interested in their children's education. These parents work as teachers, technicians, nurses, imams, and so on. They are considered middle class. They will pay symbolic annual fees for access to the library, to help maintain the services.

Mr. Amhal reports the following as primary beneficiaries:

- High school students (15 to 19 years old)
- University students (20 to 25 years old, visiting from the university in Agadir)
- Teachers
 (Teachers of English are in desperate need of such a cultural space where they can
 read and discuss books, polish their language, teach their kids, and cultivate their
 language skills. They can either pay an annual symbolic fee or volunteer as coaches,
 mentors, guides, or coordinators of the library and its clubs.)

Mr. Amhal reports this expected impact on local students and families:

- Through real partnership with the immediate community, this book space will contribute to effective family engagement to support children's learning and development.
- This space will spread among families the need to shift part of their attention towards their children's education and personal development. Trusted teachers, librarian, guest speakers, artists, and ex-students will be there to inspire, guide, teach, and motivate and to open up students' minds on more interesting and positive life interests.
- The library users will be better equipped to become active good citizens, through
 hosting informative discussions on topics and matters related to students'
 personal development such as drugs, sexuality, internet and social media, higher
 studies orientation, friendship, school bullying, and love relationships among
 teenagers.
- Access to high-quality materials and activities will enhance students' school achievement.
- The positive experiences of this program will reduce the currently high dropout rates of school among teenagers.
