Latrines for Improving Children's Health and Environment Protection Bonyoh, Bali, Indonesia

Needs Assessment:

- River water, used for drinking and cooking is contaminated with human fecal matter causing diarrhea, E.coli, and diphtheria. Sickness for all is recurring and inescapable.
- TGUP has previously funded 126 latrines in Ban, Belong and Pucang.
- This project will provide 36 additional latrines to be shared by 146 people.



In the remote Bonyoh hamlet in the area of Ban in East Bali, Indonesia, nearly 95% of the families do not have toilets, running water or electricity. Illiteracy is close to 100%. The land and water then become contaminated by fecal matter. Sickness and death results from diarrhea, diphtheria, and E.coli. The problem is especially acute for children under 5.

TGUP, in partnership with East Bali Poverty Project (EBPP), will build 36 pit latrines throughout the hamlet that will be shared by 37 families with 146 people (including 67 children). The goal is to insulate the water supply from human waste and reduce related sicknesses.

The latrines cost \$296 each and will also include a small bathing facility to help improve children's health. All of the costs of the project are for materials: concrete blocks, cement, pipes and toilets. The local residents are contributing all of the labor, roofing, doors and sand to the project. EBPP oversees design and construction.
