A Brief History about primary school of Dibanda

The primary school Dibanda is found in Dibanda village community. The school is being attended by very poor village children aged 4-12 years, many of whom are orphans, girls and internally displaced children. Indeed, the establishment of the school 15 years ago has facilitated school attendance for school going age children who had no access before and/or who used to walk long distances to attend school especially the less privilege children. A total of 362 pupils attends Dibanda community primary school of which 190 are girls and 172 boys based on the head teacher. Presently the school is being managed by the poor peasant community (Parent Teacher Association) who are struggling to raise funds to pay six (6) teachers employed to teach in the school.

Unfortunately due to poverty many children go to school without any learning materials, and have to struggle to remember what they're being taught in their lessons. Among these are 140 children who are mostly orphans, girls and internally displaced children attending Dibanda primary school. They do not have a school bag, nor essential school materials like books, pens, pencils, a lunch back, eraser, uniforms etc. These children were identified by the school administration and some members of the

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community. They are mostly internally displaced children most of whom lost their parents in the conflict or war. They may stay out of school if their situation is not addressed properly.

A School bag for these children containing essential school materials (pens, pencils, rulers, erasers, exercise books, lunch box etc), can provide vastly improved learning capabilities, hope and a lifeline to a future out of poverty.

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
