Needs Assessment:

- The October 16, 2021, earthquake destroyed many houses and temples.
- This is one of the poorest communities in Bali so the people cannot afford to rebuild.
- The local community is providing all the labor, so the only cost is for materials.



In the remote hamlets of Ban in East Bali, Indonesia, nearly 95% of the families do not have toilets, running water or electricity. Illiteracy is close to 100%. The people struggle just to survive and feed their families but are committed to helping their children have better lives.

In response to the 4.8 Richter scale earthquake that struck on October 16, 2021, at 4:12am, TGUP donated funds to build four semi-permanent A-frame structures to house people whose homes had been completely destroyed.

The latest data shows that 363 houses were totally destroyed, 762 suffered light-medium damage, and 123 temples were moderately to seriously damaged. Thousands of people lost everything and were forced to stay in temporary tents.

TGUP's partner, East Bali Poverty Project, is managing the construction of the shelters.
