

Brief History and Description: Moli is a typical slum farming community in the Southwest Region of Cameroon. Moli has a growing population of over 10,000 inhabitants, most of whom are poor peasant farmers with very low income. Most families earn less than two dollars a day and live below the UN poverty line. Illiteracy and birth rates in the community are quite high, with girls being most vulnerable.

Moli village operates a lone primary school, which is attended by very poor village children aged 5-12 years. It has 422 pupils of which 246 are girls and 176 boys. Many are orphans, girls, and internally displaced children living with local relatives. The establishment of the school 19 years ago improved attendance for children who had no school or had to walk long distances to another school.

The school is managed by the poor peasant community (PTA) who are doing their best to ensure their children have access to education by struggling to raise funds to pay six (06) teachers employed to teach in the school. The poor peasant community is unable to raise enough funds to construct a new toilet facility for vulnerable children attending Moli community primary school. The existing toilet facility which was constructed so many years ago is full and the walls have collapse. Children have been restricted from using the toilet facility as it may collapse at any time. The absence of toilet facility at Moli community primary school has compelled many pupils to defecate in nearby farms, streams, behind their classrooms and pavements. It is common to see children practicing open defecation around the school environment, especially the younger scholars behind classrooms. This has made the school environment not conducive for teaching learning process due to bad odour from the school environment especially behind classrooms.

Dimensions: The entire toilet will be 4 meters deep. The length will be four meters long by 1meter 10cm wide

Community Contribution: The local community through the Parents Teachers Association (PTA) has pledge to provide voluntary unskilled labour in excavating the toilet pit as their contribution for the project.
