A Brief History about Presbyterian primary school

Presbyterian primary school is one of the primary schools in Bomaka community, which is being attended by very poor and needy children, aged 4-12 years, many of whom are orphans, girls and internally displaced children. Indeed, the establishment of the school 15 years ago has facilitated school attendance for school-going age children who had no access before and/or who used to walk long distances to attend school, especially the less privileged children. Today the school is being attended mostly by less privileged children (orphans, poor, needy and internally displaced children) whose parents/guidance cannot afford fees in other schools in the community. A total of 242 children attend Presbyterian nursery & primary school Bomaka, of which we have 138 girls and 104 boys based on the head teacher. The school is managed by the congregation of Bomaka church, who are doing their best to ensure these children have access to education by struggling to raise funds to pay six (6) teachers employed to teach in the school. 85% of these less privileged children attending Presbyterian primary school are owing a token which is collected as fees due to poverty. This has made the management of the school difficult because of limited resources.

Unfortunately due to poverty many children go to school without any learning materials, and have to struggle to remember what they're being taught in their lessons. It is common to see these kids in class with just a single exercise book serving four (04) different subjects with no pencil, pen or eraser or textbook. School supplies (exercise books, pens, pencils, rulers, erasers, sharpeners etc), for these children can provide vastly improved learning capabilities, hope and a lifeline to a future out of poverty.
