Country	Project Name	Project Cost	Description	Photo
Kenya	Kanjuu School Classroom	\$14,177	TGUP will fund the construction of a new classroom for the Kanjuu Secondary School. The school has 4 classrooms, all in need of repair, for the current enrollment of 140 students. There are many more students that would like to attend but the Ministry of Education has limited enrollment due to the crumbling facilities.	
Kenya	Kanjuu School Kitchen	\$9,325	The new kitchen is just part of a larger campaign at the Kanjuu Secondary School where TGUP, in partnership with Kiini Sustainable Initiative, will also build a new classroom, refurbish a science lab, provide two cooking jikos for the new kitchen, and install electricity throughout the entire school. The current kitchen is so run-down that it has become almost impossible to use.

<p>Nepal</p>	<p><u>Barahachhetra School Playground</u></p>	<p>\$6,109</p>	<p>The Nepal Women Community Service Center and the local community will contribute 20% of the cost to install a playground at the Barahachhetra Secondary School. The school has 593 students but no play equipment.</p>	
<p>Brazil</p>	<p><u>Pavão Pavãozinho Playground</u></p>	<p>\$3,480</p>	<p>Above Rio de Janeiro, there are more than 1.5 million people (24% of the population of Rio) who live in favelas (slums). The many residents of the Pavãozinho community don't have any place to gather and the children have no place to play. Alongside our local partner, we will install a playground structure surrounded by an e-garden, a BBQ and benches.</p>	
<p>Kenya</p>	<p><u>Olemoncho Primary School Latrines</u></p>	<p>\$6,000</p>	<p>Working with the OliveSeed Foundation, this project will construct latrines at the Olemoncho Primary School in Maasai Mara, Kenya. Currently 325 pupils and 10 staff are sharing two toilets, which are almost full and at risk of collapse. The school enrollment is expected to double within two years to close to 600 students.</p>	

Kenya	Mucagara Secondary School Latrines	\$6,000	Kiini Sustainable Initiative, TGUP's Kenyan partner, will build 4 latrines exclusively for the girls at Mucagara Mixed Day Secondary School in Ngariama, Kirinyaga county. Girls end up having to wait in line to use the latrines, often causing them to be late for class. And there is no place to wash up, which is particularly troublesome when a girl has her period. She often ends up skipping school altogether, leading to eventual dropout.	
Kenya	Kiangi Primary School Latrines	\$6,000	This building with 4 stalls of latrines will exclusively be for the girls at Kiangi Primary School in Mathira, Nyeri county. It currently has 13 teaching staff and 220 students. There are 8 classrooms but 5 have been condemned, so two grades are taught offsite.	
Kenya	Kanjuu Secondary School Jikos	\$4,320	This project will provide the purchase and installation of two cooking jikos for a new kitchen. The kitchen is part of a larger campaign at the Kanjuu Secondary School where TGUP, in partnership with Kiini Sustainable Initiative, will also build a new classroom, refurbish a science lab, and install electricity throughout the entire school.	


Small Projects


Indonesia	Latrines for Banyoh Hamlet, Bali	\$296 per latrine	<p>Working with East Bali Poverty Project, TGUP will fund 36 latrines to be shared by 146 people (including 67 children) in the Banyoh hamlet. There are total of 37 families in the hamlet, none of which have a toilet and still practice open defecation in the bush. Each latrine costs less than \$300 and will help insulate the water supply from E.coli, preventing sickness and even death. You can fund as little as one latrine or as many as 36.</p>	
Kenya	Kanjuu Secondary School Sports Field	\$2,723	<p>This is an add-on project to the classroom, electricity and science lab that are currently being funded at the Kanjuu Secondary School. The school does not have any sports facilities for girls - this project will fund both a netball and volleyball court as well as provision equipment and supplies.</p>	
Nicaragua	Luz de Cristo School Playground	\$1,412	<p>TGUP will build a new classroom for the rural community of Luz de Cristo, outside of Tipitapa, Managua. The school does not have any playground or area for the children outside of class. We will install a playground with three structures: a slide, swings with 4 seats and monkey bars.</p>	

Nicaragua	Luz de Cristo School Solar Panels	\$719	As part of TGUP's new classroom for the elementary school of Luz de Cristo, solar panels will be installed on both the existing school building as well as on the new classroom. This will allow the students and teachers to see during cloudy days and permit the villagers to use the buildings after school hours for community meetings, adult education, vocational training and the provision of health care by government health staff.	
Kenya	Maasai Mara High School Library	\$2,000	Working with OliveSeed Foundation, TGUP will help fund the installation of a library for the Maasai Mara High School in the village of Aitong. This all-boys school has 295 students and 12 staff but no library. The school population is expected to double in the next few years. This will be the third library TGUP has helped build with OliveSeed, the others being in Morocco.	
Nepal	Health Clinic Covered Shelter	\$1,740	Partnering with the Little Sisters Fund, TGUP will build a covered shelter for this health center, which provides a full range of medical services to over 9,000 people in surrounding area. Currently patients have to wait outside exposed to extreme weather conditions: it is frequently either very hot and sunny or raining and muddy.	

Kenya	Kanjuu Secondary School Electricity	\$1,814	This is the second of three projects planned for the Kanjuu Secondary School: TGUP also plans to build a new classroom and furnish the existing science lab with shelving and cupboards. The school has electricity to a few rooms but the wiring is old, frayed and dangerous. This project will install electricity throughout the entire school.	
Kenya	Kanjuu Secondary School Science Lab	\$2,286	This is the third of three projects planned for the Kanjuu Secondary School: along with a new classroom and electrical installation. This project will provide 3 locking cupboards and 30 shelves for the existing science lab. Once the room is prepared, TGUP will install its first ever Science Lab in a Box (SLaB) , which will provide all the materials, supplies, and equipment needed to teach Biology, Chemistry and Physics.	

Save a Girl

Various	Save a Girl kits	\$6.00 per kit	<p>More than 20 million adolescent girls drop out of school every year because they cannot manage their period. It is probably the greatest preventable loss of human potential in the world.</p> <p>TGUP's Save a Girl Project addresses this problem by providing girls with washable, reusable, cloth sanitary pads. A Save a Girl "kit" costs about \$6 to make, but they are given free of charge to the girls.</p>	
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Various	<u>Save a Girl Affiliate Sewing Center</u>	\$1,500	<p>SaG kits are made at TGUP <u>Affiliate</u> Sewing Centers and <u>Associate</u> Sewing Centers in developing world countries. Both types of Centers are independently owned and operated but use TGUP technology, which is provided at no cost. They employ local seamstresses in well-paying, meaningful work helping girls in their own community.</p> <p><u>Affiliate</u> Sewing Centers benefit from TGUP's intellectual property and support in logistics. No commitment to fund kits is expected.</p>
