On January 29th, TGUP distributed its [1,000,000th Save a Girl™ \(SaG\) pad](#), to a girl at Sweetwaters Primary School in Nyeri, Kenya.

One million of anything is significant. For helping developing world girls stay in school it is monumental. It is life-changing for the girls and grows the available potential of the entire human race.

An Amazing Transformation

On February 3rd, we completed construction of three new classrooms at the Mbuluyenji School in Mambwe, Zambia. Zambia is the fifth poorest country in the world. You have to see this to believe it.

That grass canopy was the old school. There are 436 students, so you can figure out how well that was working. And, here, at the right, is the inside of one of the new classrooms. You can also figure out how much better this will be working. Which school would you rather *your* children attend?

Here's what the children had to say.



This project (which included new latrines, a water well, playground, and more) cost \$60,000. It was funded by the Gohel family in California, which enlisted help from 53 extended family members and friends. That is exactly the TGUP model: “Even the greatest waterfall starts with a single drop of water.” Thank you, Gohel family and friends!

Some Additional Typical Projects

The Balita School, in Uganda, needed a new kitchen, badly. No, worse than badly. Desperately. The school has 719 students. This was the old kitchen, inside and out. Is that desperate?



So, 18 donors helped fund a new one. This is the new one, finished about a week ago, also inside and out.



Which kitchen would you rather *your* children be fed from?

The Robotics team at Mission San Jose High School in Fremont, CA is raising funds to install one of TGUP's **Science Lab in a Box™ (SLaB)** at a high school in Uganda. The Fremont Bridge Rotary Club, also in Fremont, CA, is matching what the team brings in.

Here's the Robotics team:



And, here are students using previously-installed SLaBs in Uganda:



This project will help 200,000 high school students in Uganda do world class laboratory work in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. It will raise the scientific IQ of the entire country, which is precisely the goal. It's probably a first in the world.

What you're seeing in all of the above is the TGUP model in action. That model is simplicity personified.

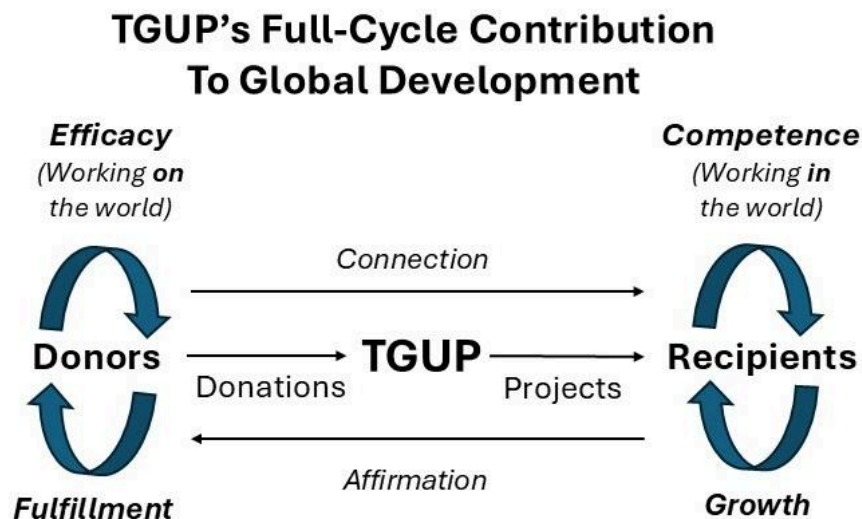
- Donors put in whatever they're comfortable with.

We've completed [642 projects in 26 developing world countries](#) using this model. Classrooms. Science labs. Libraries. Latrines. Kitchens. Playgrounds, and more. Whatever it takes to improve the educational experience.

Over their durations, those projects will help **4.4 MILLION** of the world's poorest children have just a slightly better chance in life. It is SO working.

Here's a graphic abstraction of why this works.



Note that you need both sides of the equation to make it work, and that Donors gain Efficacy and Fulfillment from their part. It works!
